Fees by Jason Smartt)

This matter is before the Court upon the application and request by Jason Smartt for exemption from the fees imposed by the Electronic Public Access fee schedule adopted by the Judicial Conference of the United States Courts.

The Court finds that Jason Smartt, an Assistant Public Defender assigned to defendants charged in capital cases, requires resources on death penalty advocacy available through PACER. Further, the Court finds that the Kansas Board of Indigent Defense Services does not have the ability to pay the statutory established access fee. The Court finds that the applicant falls within the class of persons listed in the fee schedule as being eligible for a fee exemption. Additionally, Jason Smartt has demonstrated that an exemption is necessary in order to avoid unreasonable burdens and to promote public access to information.


Accordingly, Jason Smartt shall be exempt from the payment of fees for access via PACER to the electronic case files maintained in this Court, to the extent such use is incurred in the course of such research. He shall not be exempt from the payment of fees incurred in connection with other uses of PACER system in this Court.

Additionally, the following limitations apply:

- This fee exemption applies only to Jason Smartt and is valid only for the purposes stated above;
- This fee exemption applies only to the electronic case files of this court that are available through the PACER system;
- By accepting this exemption, Jason Smartt agrees not to sell for profit any data obtained as a result of receiving this exemption;
- This exemption is valid until April 30, 2016.

This exemption may be revoked at the discretion of the Court at any time. A copy of this Order shall be sent to the PACER Service Center.
