There has been called to our attention the fact that probably there have been violations against the United States by various parties which violations have grown out of the existing strike of certain Mid-Continent Petroleum Corporation employees. We find that many complaints have been submitted to Whit Mauzy, United States Attorney for the Northern District of Oklahoma, by various persons and by strikers and officials of the Mid-Continent Petroleum Corporation and it is the concensus opinion of your grand jury that the said United States Attorney has fairly, honestly and impartially inquired into all complaints and we, your grand jury, concur in the action of the United States Attorney concerning said complaints.

Statements have been presented to us concerning probable violations against the United States but our investigation discloses that no investigation has been conducted by an impartial, fact finding body because the evidence concerning said violations has not been heretofore presented to the proper Government officials and we, therefore, recommend that a full and complete investigation by an impartial Government Agency be made and that if said investigation discloses probable violations against the United States that the same be presented to a Grand Jury properly convened and it is our opinion that our recommendation in concurred in by the United States Attorney for the Northern District of Oklahoma and the Attorney General of the United States.
