It Is ADJUDGED that ⁴ imposition of sentence is hereby suspended and the defendant is placed on probation for a period of Two (2) years from this date, pursuant to the Federal Youth Correction Act, Title 18, U.S.C.A. 5010(a), under the conditions that the defendant reunite with family, get a job and keep it, and avoid association with any know criminals.

It Is FURTHER ORDERED that during the period of probation the defendant shall conduct himself as a law-abiding, industrious citizen and observe such conditions of probation as the Court may prescribe. Otherwise the defendant may be brought before the court for a violation of the court's orders.

It Is FURTHER ORDERED that the clerk deliver three certified copies of this judgment and order to the probation officer of this court, one of which shall be delivered to the defendant by the probation officer.
