It Is ADJUDGED that the defendant upon his plea of<sup>2</sup> guilty

has been convicted of the offense of having violated Title 18, USC, Sections 7 & 13, in that on or about 6-22-68 at Sheppard Air Force Base, on lands acquired for use by the U.S., and under the exclusive jurisdiction thereof, & in the Wichita Falls Division of the Northern District of Texas, David Howard Church did then and there unlawfully & with intent to defraud, make, draw, utter & deliver to Sheppard Air Force Base Exchange No. 1, Sheppard Air Force Base, Texas, a certain check, No. 122, drawn on the account of David H. Church, in the amount of \$50, upon the First and Citizens National Bank, Alexandria, Virginia, and the defendant at the time said check was so made, drawn, uttered & delivered, did not have, and knew he did not have, sufficient funds in said bank with which to pay said check

and his attorney as charged<sup>3</sup> in the Information and the court having asked the defendant whether he has anything to say why judgment should not be pronounced, and no sufficient cause to the contrary being shown or appearing to the Court,

It Is ADJUDGED that the defendant is guilty as charged and convicted.

It Is ADJUDGED that the defendant is hereby committed to the custody of the Attorney General or his authorized representative for imprisonment for a period of<sup>4</sup>

On this 14th day of January, 1969, came the attorney for the government and the defendant appeared in person, and with counsel, Jefferson Greer.

It IS ADJUDGED that the defendant has been convicted upon his plea of guilty,

of the offense of having violated T.26, USC, 4744(a)(1), in that on or about July 31, 1968 and August 9, 1968, at Tulsa, Oklahoma, in the Northern District of Oklahoma, he, being a transferee of marihuana required to pay the tax imposed by Section 4741(a), Title 26, United States Code, did acquire and obtain certain quantities of marihuana without having paid such tax, as charged in Counts One and Two of the Information.

as charged and the court having asked the defendant whether he has anything to say why judgment should not be pronounced, and no sufficient cause to the contrary being shown or appearing to the court,

It IS ADJUDGED that the defendant is guilty as charged and convicted.

It IS ADJUDGED that imposition of sentence as to Counts One and Two is hereby suspended and the defendant is placed on probation for a period of five (5) years from this date as to each count.

It IS FURTHER ORDERED that during the period of probation the defendant shall conduct himself as a law-abiding, industrious citizen and observe such conditions of probation as the Court may prescribe. Otherwise the defendant may be brought before the court for a violation of the court's orders.

It IS FURTHER ORDERED that the clerk deliver three certified copies of this judgment and order to the probation officer of this court, one of which shall be delivered to the defendant by the probation officer.
