has been convicted of the offense of having violated T. 18, USC, 495, in that on or about 6-13-69 in Tulsa, Oklahoma, in the Northern District of Oklahoma, Ruby Jean Moore, for the purpose of obtaining or receiving from the U. S. a sum of money, did falsely forge a certain writing, and with intent to defraud the U. S., uttered and published as true a forged writing, containing on the reverse side thereof a forged endorsement, she then knowing said endorsement to be forged, as charged in Counts 1 & 2 of the Indictment

and her attorney ~~appeared~~ and the court having asked the defendant whether she has anything to say why judgment should not be pronounced, and no sufficient cause to the contrary being shown or appearing to the court,

It IS ADJUDGED that the defendant is guilty as charged and convicted.

It IS ADJUDGED that the imposition of sentence in Counts One and Two is hereby suspended and that the defendant is placed on probation for a period of Two (2) Years from this date, as to each count, concurrently, pursuant to the Federal Youth Correction Act, Title 18, U.S.C.A. 5010(a).

It IS FURTHER ORDERED that during the period of probation the defendant shall conduct himself as a law-abiding, industrious citizen and observe such conditions of probation as the Court may prescribe. Otherwise the defendant may be brought before the court for a violation of the court's orders.

It IS FURTHER ORDERED that the clerk deliver three certified copies of this judgment and order to the probation officer of this court, one of which shall be delivered to the defendant by the probation officer.
