

CURRENT COVID ON-SITE SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

MASKS

1. Wearing masks is optional. Employees, visitors, jurors, etc. may choose to wear a mask, or not, at their own discretion.
2. Each Judicial Officer will determine appropriate policies for their courtroom proceedings.

COVID POSITIVE TEST OR COVID SYMPTOMS

3. If you have COVID-related symptoms and test positive or do not test, regardless of your vaccination status, you may not enter the courthouse until at least 5 full days after you first developed symptoms, with the day your symptoms began as Day 0, and you have been fever free for 24 hours (without the use of fever-reducing medication) and your symptoms have improved.
4. You must wear a mask at all times until 10 days after the onset of symptoms, with the day your symptoms began as Day 0.

COVID EXPOSURE

5. If you were exposed to COVID-19 and are NOT up-to-date on COVID-19 vaccinations, you may not enter the courthouse until at least 5 full days after the date of the exposure, with the day of exposure as Day 0, and you have either tested negative or you have no COVID-related symptoms. You must wear a mask at all times until 10 days after the date of the exposure, with the day of your exposure as Day 0.
6. If you were exposed to COVID-19 and are up-to-date on COVID-19 vaccinations you may enter the courthouse. You must wear a mask at all times until 10 days after the date of the exposure, with the day of your exposure as Day 0.
